# 10+ English words that have Hungarian origins

English is a global language, there is no denying that, but over the course of its history, it has been influenced and impacted by many other languages and cultures, from French to German, from Greek and Latin to Spanish, but also Hungarian. Although the Hungarian language and culture did not impact English as much as some other languages, there are still some words in English that originate from the Central-Eastern European country of Hungary. Magyarországon collected some of these words for you, and we tried to find sources (sometimes with added emphasis) to support their origin.

## Itsy-bitsy

We should start with the outlier. Although it might not have a true etymological connection to the Hungarian phrase of the same meaning, as I could not find any truly reliable sources, the resemblance is uncanny. In Hungary, we use the phrase ‘icipici’, which not only looks very similar, but it sounds almost identical and has an almost identical meaning.

## Coach

“Found in nearly all European languages since the 16th century; Spanish ‘coche’, Italian ‘cocchio’, German ‘kutsche’, Polish ‘kocz’, etc. All originate from the Hungarian ‘kocsi’, used in Hungary from the reign of King Matthias Corvinus, 1458–90.” – Oxford English Dictionary.

Kocsi’ is an adjective, meaning ‘of Kocs /kɒtʃ/’, a place south of Komorn, between Raab and Buda, which...

# 10 iconic Hungarian food and drinks you must try in Budapest

World of Food & Drinks assembled a list of the top 10 things everyone should try in Budapest, and also added where to find them when one visits Hungary's capital. The list contains the most iconic traditional Hungarian dishes and drinks to die for. Recipes for many of these dishes can be found in Daily New Hungary's "recipe of the week" series.

## Soups

1. Fisherman's soup (Halászlé) Hungarian Fisherman's soup is similar to fish paprikash, but with more water. This delicious spicy soup is usually made from carp caught in the river Danube. The recipe relies on the traditional paprika powder, which gives the soup's bright red colour. Most famous versions of fisherman's soup are: fisherman's soup of Baja, Szeged and the Tisza region. 2. Goulash (Gulyás) Goulash is one of the (if not the No. 1) most famous Hungarian dishes. Goulash is a rich stew made of meat and vegetables, and with lots of paprika. Traditionally, it is made from beef, but you can also find goulash made from pork or chicken. You can try the goulash in almost every restaurant in Budapest, but for a unique dining experience, you can go to Vagon restaurant or Gettó Gulyás.

# Weird Hungarian habits that shock foreign people

There are many Hungarian habits which freak foreigners out when they first hear, see, or encounter them. These include the traditional Hungarian food mákos guba and the sweet delicacy túró rudi, or celebrating name days.

The first thing which caught their eye is the sweet delicacy called túró rudi, which is a Hungarian dessert: cottage cheese covered with chocolate. Without it, Hungarians cannot imagine their lives at all. For a foreigner, it is weird to cover cottage cheese with chocolate and to eat it.

Another foreigner emphasised that, unlike other big cities, dog excrement cannot be found on the streets of Budapest. They believe that Hungarian dogs are trained to do their thing near a bush or under a tree while they are on a walk in the city with their owners. They say that Budapest is an extremely clean city, and maybe there is someone who cleans up the mess every day. This foreigner also reported that the quality of Hungarian food is amazing and – even though it is not a traditional Hungarian food – ate more pizzas than back in New Orleans. This man also stated that in the USA, the waiters usually come to you at a restaurant, talk to you for a few minutes, and then leave the table. # Coronavirus – Hungarian government orders state of emergency

The government has ordered a state of emergency in connection with protective measures against the new coronavirus, Gergely Gulyás, the head of the Prime Minister's Office, said on Wednesday.

Gulyás said the government had made its decision in line with a proposal by the interior minister and the operative board. The government has ordered a ban on travellers from Italy, China, South Korea and Iran, except for Hungarian citizens arriving from those locations who will have to stay in isolation at home for two weeks after arrival, Gulyás added.

In order to enforce the travel restrictions, border controls will be reintroduced on Hungary's Schengen borders with Slovenia and Austria. All trains, buses and flights from the countries in question will also be stopped by midnight on Wednesday, he added.

The government has also decided to ban indoor events with more than 100 people attending, while outdoor events with more than 500 will also be subject to the ban, Gulyás said. It will be the organisers' responsibility to cancel events, he added. Any documents that are to expire in the near future will remain valid during the state of emergency, he added. All measures will remain valid until further notice, he said.

# Hungarian man was killed in Budapest's 8th district; he wanted to defend his puppy

A 25-year-old Hungarian man was stabbed to death on tram 28 in Budapest's 8th district. The homicide case happened at Orczy square after the three-member-group started to pick a fight with the victim. According to an eyewitness, the young man wanted to defend his puppy.

The 25-year-old victim, Gábor was going home with his small dog and 24-year-old friend Márk when the three perpetrators (two men and a woman) attacked him. "The whole situation happened within a minute, between two stops. As the three persons got on the tram, they targeted Gábor and started to poke his dog" – said the victim's friend, Márk.

"Gábor asked them to leave him in peace, then one of them pushed him and spat on him. When I rose to protect my friend, they hit me; then one of them pulled a knife and stuck it into Gábor. I tried to help him, Gábor said he was very thirsty, cannot breathe and will die..."

Mark tried to clamp the bleeding, but he couldn't save Gábor's life; his best friend died in his arms.

The victim's small dog, Pepsi got so frightened that he ran away from the scene, but has been found since then.

Gábor's parents, who live in Ireland, are on their way to Budapest.

## 3 easy Hungarian recipes you can make in 15 minutes

We have collected three of the easiest and undeniably the most characteristic Hungarian dishes you can easily try at home. They could be made within fifteen minutes and are very budget-friendly. They use many ingredients you might already have at home. These recipes are delicious in themselves, but they are also recipes that you can easily customise to your taste. Try them and conduct your own culinary experiments to create the perfect dish for yourself or your loved ones.

### Lángos (sour scone)

The dough can be made within 5 minutes, and frying should take about 10 minutes. If done correctly, it is very delicious with a slightly crunchy outside and soft inside. You can put spices in the dough or put almost anything on top. In Hungary, the most common way to eat it is to brush the dough with garlic and then add sour cream and grated cheese on top. If you crave real delicacies, you can put Bolognese ragout or bean goulash on it. Some places even make it with sausages in the dough. Ingredients: 400g plain flour, ½ pack baking powder, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 ½ teaspoon pizza seasoning (not necessary), 3 tablespoons olive oil, 2 tablespoons kefir (fermented milk drink), 1 ½ – 2 dl water

### Method

Mix the flour with the baking powder, salt and spices. Add the oil...

# Funzine Guide: Six Locations Related to 15 March

The Revolution of 1848 made a big impact on Hungarian history. The day of its outburst, 15 March (bank holiday since 1989) is often referred to as the birth of the modern parliamentary Hungary. Commemorating the occasion, let us invite you for a walk from one historical location to another.

## Hungarian National Museum

Designed by Mihály Pollack, the museum's building is a classicist masterpiece that was opened just a few months prior to the revolution. It is believed that things escalated on 15 March when famous poet Sándor Petőfi cited his revolutionary poem „National Song” while standing on the stairs of the museum in front of thousands of people. Historians say the details of what really happened are unclear since the first written source that reported about the events appeared only decades later, and it is a known fact that the author was not even close to the museum at the time. However, a marble board was placed near the stairs to mark the building as a historical site.

## Former Landerer Printing House

Located on the corner of Kossuth Lajos utca and Szép utca, right behind the Saint Peter of Alcantara Church of Ferenciek tere, the once famous Horváth-ház gave home to Landerer and Heckenast's printing house where Lajos Kossuth (nobleman, journalist, governor of the Kingdom of Hungary between 1848-49) edited a liberal party newspaper...

# How Will Budapest Survive the Climate Emergency?

Interview with Réka Hunyadi from Greenpeace Hungary

The first time Réka Hunyadi showed interest in environment protection was during her university studies when she decided to spend the summer at a bio farm in Switzerland as a volunteer, after which she was an environmental volunteer in Northern Ireland. Her vocation soon turned into a career: she worked on green projects and environmental communication for several non-profit organizations, took up a job as an executive producer to a green-themed TV show, and became the Head of Communication at Greenpeace Hungary in 2016. Ever since she has fought for one common goal with the organization: to restore the harmony between human and nature.

You have recently submitted a set of proposals to the local government of Budapest, listing the most urgent actions on climate emergency.

It is a vision for 2030 that includes plans, which may seem extreme today, such as the transformation of the quayside in downtown Budapest into a car-free public park zone. Restricting traffic is a possible answer to climate emergency as it would reduce the use of fuels in the city while benefiting its residents who could enjoy clean air. Climate protection is linked to our well-being. It's all about how people have lost their contact with nature, which needs to be restored...

# 5 Hiking Spots Close to Budapest That Look Magical in Winter

Finding a good hiking spot is worth more than it did before, as nowadays there's not much pastime activities that are better than walking in the nature. Here comes five walking trails in and around Budapest that are open for shorter (from 20 minutes to 3 hours) winter hikes.

## Fekete István Educational Path

2020 marked the 120th anniversary of Hungarian writer István Fekete's birth, on the occasion of which the Pilis Park Forestry Company dedicated a new educational path to the litterateur on Mount Kis-Hárs located nearby Normafa. The 800 meters long walking trail starts around Szent Ferenc Hospital, close to the former home of Fekete, who is also known as the Hungarian chronicler of nature. The kid-friendly path is lined with five QR code boards that share useful and interesting information about the writer's life and oeuvre, as well as the natural gems and flora of the land.

## Teve Rock

Less than a 30-minute car ride from Budapest, at the south-eastern foot of the Pilis Mountains, you'll find the village of Pilisborosjenő. The nearby mountains serve as the perfect location of an easy, 10,5 kilometres long hike to the replica of the Eger Castle located at the south-western slopes of Nagy-Kevély and a fascinating rock formation known as Teve-szikla (Camel Rock)...

# Juicy Facts about the Hungarian Cuisine

There are several misconceptions about the Hungarian cuisine which couldn't be further from the truth. To clear the air, we'll give you an introduction to our literally colourful gastronomy and tell you what should not be missing from your culinary bucket list when in Budapest.

We, Hungarians have all heard stereotypes about our cuisine before, most of which are related to our “too generous” use of onion and garlic. As opposed to this unfortunate popular belief, our gastronomy is not a one-trick pony that can only operate on these two bulbous vegetables. Different types of meat, fresh vegetables, fruits, white bread, dairy products and honey are all inevitable parts of the Hungarian kitchen: we have countless veggie and fruit soups, creamy vegetable meals, hot pasta dishes (túrós csusza aka square pasta with curd cheese, sour cream and bacon crumbles is a must-try), and flavourful sauces and meat specialties made from poultry, beef, lamb, pork, fish and wild game.

Considering the wide array of spices that we use, it is technically impossible to have a dull cuisine. Just to mention a few: we add bay leaf (which has a flavour arsenal of more than 50 compounds) to potato sauce, bean and tomato soups and use cumin for cabbage dishes, sausages, sauces and baked pork meals. Tarragon is also our friend, perfect for seasoning poultry, wild game meat, salads, green bean and many more...

# Interview with the Budapest Street Photography Collective

Budapest Street Photography Collective, a group of 12 Hungarian photographers, was established last year with the aim of capturing the everyday moments of Budapest in a way we have never seen them before. From student to product designer, people from diverse backgrounds belong to the team, but they all share one passion: street photography. We sat down with two BPSPC members, Imre Szalai and Ádám Temesi to ask them about the mission of the team, the ups and downs of taking street photos in Budapest, and many more.

What's the main goal of BPSPC?

Imi: As a collective, we aspire to take candid photographs in a world dominated by staged images and show what Budapest is like in an uncompromising way. We don't expect people to pose for our pictures, but it would be great if they didn't feel threatened when being photographed.

Do you take thematic shots with the team?

Imi: Yeah, before the pandemic we agreed to photograph different districts of Budapest every month, then gather to discuss all the shots we've taken and create a zine out of the best ones. We started with District VIII and wanted to continue with District XIII, but the coronavirus hit the country. We have also had some ideas for an annual theme. # World-Famous Hungarian Women

On the occasion of International Women's Day we remember Hungarian ladies who believed in themselves and made it big. They all had a talent for something different and worked hard to achieve success. Their efforts paid off; the below names will surely remain unforgotten for a long time.

Dr. Mária Telkes (1900-1995)

Born in Budapest, Hungarian-American biophysicist, scientist and inventor Dr. Mária Telkes was known for working on solar energy technologies, and as she was considered one of the founders of solar thermal storage systems, she was nicknamed the "Sun Queen". At the age of 25, she moved to the United States, where she was hired to work at the Cleveland Clinic Foundation. Her task was to investigate the energy produced by living organisms. She invented a miniature desalination unit called solar salt-water still which was used on lifeboats during WWII, saving the lives of torpedoed sailors and downed airmen who could collect potable water via solar power when abandoned at sea.

Estée Lauder (1906-2004)

Today a household name, the renowned cosmetic brand was founded by a Hungarian lady called Josephine Esther Mentzer, who was raised in Queens, New York by her Hungarian mother and Czech father. She became interested in beauty as a teenager when her Hungarian uncle, a chemist came to live with the family...

# The Life of Dezső Kosztolányi

Many would argue recklessly to prove that Dezső Kosztolányi was the most prominent Hungarian poet of the twentieth century, while others firmly believe that his prose cannot be compared to anything else in the Hungarian literary canon. Kosztolányi is also known to have produced a great deal of brilliant translations, or according to today's translation theory standards rather adaptations, and have published witty pieces of journalism. # From Lenient to Strict – How the Gov’t’s Position Changed on Restrictions

Even though less than two weeks ago, Prime Minister Orbán said that no further tightening of the restrictions was needed, due to the worsening epidemic situation, the government has announced extremely strict new measures since last week. Summary.

In September, the spread of the novel coronavirus started to accelerate in Hungary, which was evident not only by the increased number of cases but also by the significant change in the number of hospital admissions and fatalities. During the first half of the month the number of active cases was on a rapid rise, but the number of coronavirus-related deaths (at around 1 daily) has not yet started to increase.

At the time, Viktor Orbán said that Hungary is “awaiting the second wave of the coronavirus epidemic in full armor.” He also said that from now on Hungary’s defense will be different than it was during the spring, as the government’s priority had been to “buy time to assess the enemy and prepare the healthcare sector,” while this time “people clearly want to see Hungary functioning.”

About a week later, the Prime Minister warned that the number of new infections was expected to further increase. He noted, however, that during the second wave it was the number of deaths rather than new infections that should be focused on.

## ‘The Queen’s Gambit’ Puts Spotlight on Real-life Hungarian Chess Prodigies, the Polgár Girls

Netflix chess drama “The Queen’s Gambit,” has been on the platform’s top series list since its release. The series, which follows the story of Beth Harmon, a Kentucky orphan, and her rise as a chess prodigy in the 1950s and 1960s, shows how a woman can excel in the ruthlessly competitive, male-dominated world of chess, which also brought to light the lives of the famous Hungarian chess player sisters, the Polgár girls.

Although the series “The Queen’s Gambit” – named after a chess opening – was based on Walter Tevis’ 1983 novel, some argue that it resembles the lives and chess careers of the Polgár girls, and especially Judit Polgár, the youngest to get the Grandmaster title. However, they were born in the 70’s, two decades “after” fictional character Beth Harmon took on the also fictional Russian champion Vasily Borgov in Moscow. At the time, in real life, women weren’t even allowed to compete in the World Chess Championship – until the 1980s. In addition, Judit Polgár and her sister Zsuzsa only received their Grandmaster titles in 1991. However, whether based on one of the Polgár girls or not, the series has once again put the spotlight on the famous Hungarian chess prodigies.

# Poet with Hungarian-Jewish Roots Receives Nobel Prize in Literature

the 2020 Nobel Prize for Literature for “her incomparable poetic voice which, with austere beauty, makes individual existence universal,” the Swedish Academy said on Thursday.

The 77-year-old poet will be honored “for her unmistakable poetic voice,” with which she “makes individual existence universal with strict beauty,” said the permanent secretary of the academy, Mats Malm.

The new awardee, one of America’s most celebrated poets, was born in New York City on April 22, 1943, as the daughter of businessman Daniel Glück and Beatrice Glück (Grosby). The poet has Hungarian-Jewish roots, as her paternal grandparents emigrated from Hungary to the US, where they opened a vegetable store, while her father was the first in the family to be born in the US.

Glück’s first encounter with literature was of Greek mythology and the story of Jeanne d’Arc in her childhood. As a teenager, she suffered from anorexia nervosa, which remained a challenge throughout her young adulthood and affected her life and poetry. She spent seven years in therapy, which helped her overcome her illness. Later on, Glück studied at Columbia University, which provided an opportunity to train students with special needs.

# Trianon: Instead of the principle on self-determination of nations, the victorious great powers re-drew borders according to their geopolitical interests – Interview with historian Balázs Ablonczy

Hungary can only be held responsible for World War I as any other participating country, says historian Balázs Ablonczy, whose new book, “Unknown Trianon,” has just been published. On the other hand, the bad perception of Hungary in the world at the time played a role in that the treaty hit the country particularly hard. The leader of the Trianon 100 Lendület (Momentum) Research Group of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences does not expect a consensus on Trianon between historians of Hungary and the neighboring countries, because what was a national tragedy for us, Hungarians, was for others, a step towards the creation of their nation-states.

You write in your new book that at the beginning of the summer of 1918, it seemed that the Austro-Hungarian Monarchy reached its aims and won the war. How did it change to a historically tragic defeat so suddenly?

Well, the answer is the situation was not as rosy as seen from without. Supply disruptions became more and more serious in the Dual Monarchy. The Monarchy’s Army, which had not been able to carry out an independent offensive operation since the end of 1914 without the support of Germany, slowly collapsed...

# Why did Beethoven's Egmont Overture Become the “Hymn of the Revolution”

The Egmont overture by Ludwig van Beethoven was played so often in the October days of 1956 that it quickly became the “hymn of the revolution.” But why? Rumor has it that on the night of October 23, the revolutionists installed a mobile radio car to Parliament and resumed radio transmission from there, using telephone lines. The radio staff came across some vinyl records with Beethoven’s Egmont overture among them, resulting in it becoming the most played music during the days of fighting.

Back in the 1950’s, it was not possible to cut and edit a radio show, so there were more provisional programs. Since there was not a large selection of recordings available in the temporary studio, the ones on hand were repeated frequently. Above all works, mostly opera excerpts that corresponded to the mood of the events were played. Thus, the powerful melody of Beethoven intertwined with the events of the revolution, from the night at the Parliament, to the siege of the radio building and to the point when Imre Nagy announced at noon on October 24 that those who would immediately lay down their weapons would receive amnesty. However, the fights on the streets of Budapest continued – with Beethoven’s overture in the background.

# Hungary Now Safest Place in Europe for Jews – Rabbi Köves at the Hungary at First ‘Site’ Conference

Hungary is probably the safest place for Jews in Europe at the moment, said Chief Rabbi of the Unified Hungarian Jewish Congregation (EMIH) Slomó Köves at the international “Hungary at First ‘Site’” press conference organized by the Friends of Hungary Foundation, Hungary Today’s publisher, held online this year due to the pandemic. Although a part of the society has anti-semitic feelings, there are no physical atrocities unlike in some Western European countries.

In his presentation, Rabbi Köves referred to the establishment of their foundation called Foundation for Action and Defense (TVA). The inspiration for its founding came from the emergence of the extreme right, the growing popularity of Jobbik, certain politicians’ controversial statements around the middle of the last decade, and from the very thought that Jewish communities are responsible for themselves.

The organization’s activities are centered around three pillars, the first providing legal protection and aid for victims, or in connection with Holocaust denial cases, or making documents to help change in legislation. Research and monitoring comes next, something that they lately extended to eight more countries. The third being education (programs, textbooks, courses), which Köves deems the most important.

# Coronavirus – Ein neuer Feind aus Nirgendwo?

Epidemien sind leider begleitende Erscheinungen des menschlichen Schicksals, die uns schon viel Leiden verursachten, die immer viele Opfer forderten, trotzdem konnten wir immer durch Zusammenhalt, Disziplin und Kreativität die unsichtbaren Krankheitserreger bekämpfen. Wenn wir uns die Daten ein bisschen genauer anschauen, können wir eindeutig sagen, dass die Letalität (Anzahl der an einer bestimmten Krankheit verstorbenen/Anzahl der an einer bestimmten Krankheit Erkrankten) bei der Grippe unter 0,1% liegt, während diese Prozentzahl bei den SARS-CoV-2 Infizierten vier höher ist. Anders gesagt: dieser Krankheitserreger, dem wir gegenüberstehen, soll viel tödlicher sein als Influenza

Welche Schritte führten zum Trianon?

Kein Bestimmungsrecht in einer Kriegssituation. Staatsrechtlich gesehen bestand die österreich-ungarische Monarchie aus zwei selbständigen Staaten. Kaiser Franz Joseph I. war das gemeinsame konstitutionelle Staatsoberhaupt.
